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1. Where We Were (2017)

System Status & Institutional Challenges



1. Legacy Dependency:

A robust legal foundation but entirely constrained by decentralized paper registers.

2. Data Transmission Lags:

Moving physical paper logs to the center took up to one month.

3. Data Sharing and Integration :

No data sharing and integration among stakeholders and other partners

4. Coding Vulnerabilities:

Inconsistent field-level application of the (ICD-10) for the cause-of-death registration.

2. Where We are (2026)



1. Full Nationwide Automation:

4,571 health offices for 27 Governments .

2. Interoperability :

A Center database for Births Deaths through an efficient, secure and confidential platform including identity management, comprehensive health insurance and some public service.

3. CAPMAS (NSO) :

Direct update for the Population Clock and the month and annual reports of Births and deaths.

4. Universal Registration Coverage

including newborn of all foreigners .

3. Lessons Learned



1. What Worked:

The High-level political will aligning CRVS with Egypt Vision 2030; anchoring all public systems to a Unique National ID.

2. What Didn't Work:

Confronting initial administrative resistance and rural connectivity constraints without alternative local infrastructure.

3. Critical Success Factors:

Massive capacity building (training over 10,000 doctors and staff) and utilizing mobile GPRS/3G secured tunnels to bypass landline deficits.



4. Where We Are Going (2036)

CRVS is one of the pillars for implementing the upcoming Census 2030 Tour whereas Egypt aims to conduct the Census 2040 Tour based primarily on CRVS and other administration records.
